positive lifestyle attitude and they can tell you how they incorporate this into their own daily living.

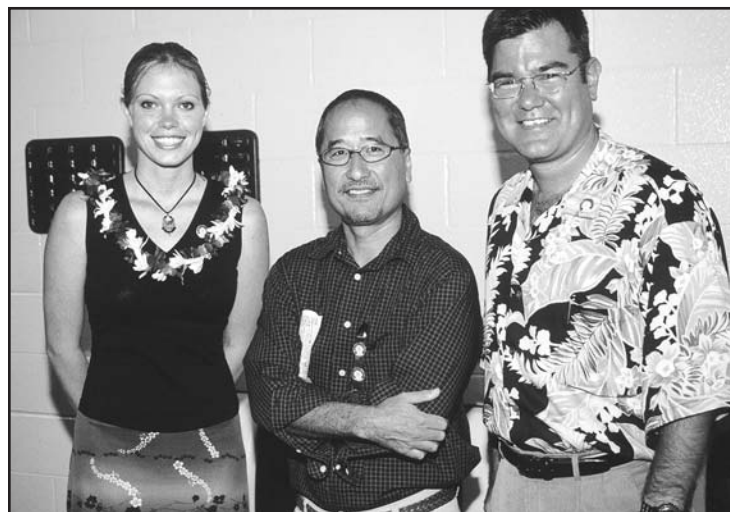
Our young people are our future, and from what I am seeing our future is in good hands.

NikeGO Imua Paddling and Hiking Program



The facts are startling:

- Kids born today are expected to have a shorter life expectancy than their parents due to inactivity and diet (*Obesity Week, Feb 3, 2002: v2, #5*)
- Nearly half of American youth (12-21) are not regularly active (*U.S. Dept of Health & Human Services: Nat'l Center for Health Statistics*)
- The percentage of overweight children in the U.S. has doubled since 1980, corresponding to a decrease in physical activity. (*Center for Disease Control and Prevention, Nat'l Center for Health Statistics*)

School funding cuts. Lack of physical education programs. Inattentive parenting. Computer games. The Internet. These are just a few of the factors supporting the unfortunate trend that kids are not involved enough in physical activity to achieve and maintain a healthy lifestyle.

To help change the dynamic, Nike launched a new national grassroots community affairs program called NikeGO. Its mission is to increase physical activity in youth by offering thousands of children ages 9 – 15 the motivation to discover the joy of movement and the fun of physical activity.

"Our message with NikeGO is simple," says Gary DeStefano, Nike President of USA Operations. "Life can be so much better when we put our bodies in motion. For young people this is especially true. Establishing a pattern of physical exercise now can only help them as they grow older."

The Boys & Girls Club of Hawaii's Kapa'a Clubhouse has been fortunate to be selected as one of the grant recipients for the IMUA canoeing and hiking program.

The Hiking program has 30 youth with hikes planned each month, in collaboration with Get Fit Kauai. Hikes are scheduled to be progressively longer and harder and the group will celebrate this June with a weekend campout at Kokee State Park.

In collaboration with the Puuwai Canoe Club, the focus of the Nike Imua Paddling Club's 30 youth members includes respect, encouragement and teamwork when they meet at Wailua River each week to learn how to hold the paddle, parts of the canoe, seating arrangements and the role each member plays in the seating order, proper stroking, and timing.

"The kids continue to be excited and ready to go," remarks Mary Nakamura, Clubhouse Director. "We are so pleased that Nike supports our youth members here in Hawaii." 🙌
